A little while ago, we sang a beautiful hymn in church titled, *It is Well*. The origins of this hymn are guite extraordinary.

It was written in 1873 by an American lawyer, Horatio Spafforth with music by Phillip Bliss.

He and his family planned to travel to Europe by ship but a last minute change meant that only the mother and four daughters sailed. The ship collided with another and sank drowning Spafforth's four daughters. When Spafforth sailed to join his wife, who had survived, he wrote the words to this hymn as the ship passed near the spot where his daughters has drowned.

It sounds a bit like a Victorian melodramatic story but apparently it is true. Ian Ogden—Source of information: Various sites on the Internet.
