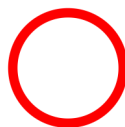

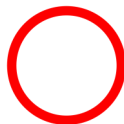

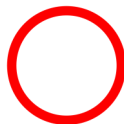
CIRCLES OF CARE

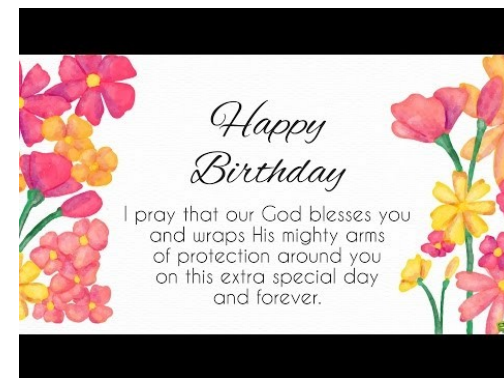

SAFE WORKING WITH CHILDREN TRAINING DAY

Proposed date: Saturday 12th September.
