Pastor's Ponderings

A blessed 2023

Welcome to worship and thank you. Thank you for making worship a priority for you and your family as you prepare to celebrate the coming of the new year, 2023. I'm sure we are all looking forward hoping that 2023 is the start of better times in our world.

Looking back, we see a world that has suffered from years of pandemic, war and strife, senseless violence, and hard economic times. But we also see the grace of God in our lives and in the world, bringing comfort in the middle of the storms of life, and strength to press on when the going gets rough. We see God at work in our lives and the world to make things look more like they should, bringing relief to the suffering, social justice for all, and genuine love and acceptance for people.
