Pastor's Ponderings

“Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.” The second is this: “Love your neighbour as yourself.” There is no commandment greater than these.’ Mark 12:30-31 (NIVUK)

Loving your neighbour as yourself is found eight times in the Bible. Not once, & not twice; eight times. Us, as followers of Jesus, loving your neighbour as yourself is so important to God that it is not only repeated, Jesus makes it a command. And not just another command in a list of many. Jesus coupled the command to love your neighbour as yourself with loving God with all our being. It sounds beautiful, and it is when we obey it.

But loving your neighbour as yourself clearly isn’t always easy & does not always come naturally. That’s why God made it a command. Making it a commandment is to our benefit. How is that? We have to do it on purpose, be intentional about it. We all know we should, but how well do Christians practice this? What can we do, to be better at loving our neighbour?

When Jesus was asked, “Who is my neighbour?” He responded with a story we call the Good Samaritan. Making a long story short, the point of the story is that the Samaritan had compassion where the religious leaders failed to show it for one reason or another. Compassion is not a feeling in our hearts, it requires action from us. Compassion does something. A heart that’s moved by compassion cannot sit idly by while someone suffers a need. Loving your neighbour as yourself is caring for another’s well-being & taking action to help to the full extent of our ability. Let’s practice loving our neighbour & actually try to do something.

Chairman's Report

We have much to be grateful for at Uniting Church Dayboro. This has become obvious when we learn of how much the church is struggling to survive in many places. We have a strong leadership team supporting a strong ministry team and are experiencing steady growth in numbers and viability. But we cannot afford to be complacent. We are just meeting our financial obligations, but delaying some work until we can afford to do it. We are also exploring several options for grants from the local government, Bendigo Bank and others. There is always plenty to do but we are reminded by Jesus in Matthew 6:33 - Seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. God wants us to live — fully live — one day at a time, relying on Him to provide all our needs, physically and spiritually.

Presbytery is currently conducting a conversation with us which is part of a review of the 30 congregations in the presbytery. This involves surveying us on all facets of our life and mission and the provision of economic forecasting. We want to increase the time we employ Ps Dan. This gives us two important factors in our favour. We are proving we can sustain ministry here and in the long term we are able to attract a minister if that becomes necessary. Our future is very much the core business of our Church Council and we are busy refining all our guidelines to ensure that they meet all the UCA and government protocols and our team works within a clear framework for decision making.

Please continue to pray for our congregation and support our development as much as you are able.

Uniting Church Dayboro - Our Fixed Expenses

The Uniting Church in Australia is a connectional church consisting of congregations, Presbyteries at a regional level, Synods at state level and a national Assembly.

Finance for many of the councils of the church begins with congregations. In past times Synods had access to funds as a result of property sales such as conference centres and camp sites. The financial services group of the Synods managed those funds in order to provide some self funding and also to offer grants to congregations to fund new initiatives. These new initiatives are now funded from a fund called the Combined Presbytery Mission Pool.

Uniting Church Dayboro like all congregations is required to contribute to this Pool. For the calendar year 2022, our contribution was \$8400 amounting to 12% of our total expenses for that year. We had other further fixed expenses amounting to \$7858 or 11%. These expenses included audit fees \$550, liability insurance \$610, repairs to non-property assets \$259, telephone and Internet \$76, permits and licence fees \$810, Blue Card application \$98, UCA Qld Sensitive Issues \$230, cleaning \$602, electricity \$1702, property insurance \$1194, council rates \$660 and water rates \$1067.

So we had \$16258 in fixed expenses in 2022 which was 23% of all expenses of \$69,893. Our income for the same year was \$78612 which included a \$14,000 government grant to improve the property including the new concrete near the front gates. By comparison the fixed expenses in calendar year 2021 was 18.7% for total expenses of \$73,536.

So the congregation has nearly 25% of its income from all sources contributing to the fixed costs to keep the church open, legal and ready for ministry and mission within the community.

Up until July 2023 we have been paying Danny 35% of a full time placement. From July 2023 we have increased the stipend to 40% of a full time placement. From January 2024 the Church Council is hoping to be in a position to fund a 50% full time placement for Danny.

How we see Jesus

The September Uniting News has an article which talks about a personal encounter with Jesus. In the article by Rev Karen Ross from Chapel Hill Uniting Church she makes some interesting points.

"The future of the church doesn't rest upon a clear theological or sociological understanding of what it means to be and do community. The future of the church rests with the people of God having a personal encounter with the love and power of Jesus. A personal encounter with Jesus can restore whatever has been injured or paralysed in you."

From my perspective Jesus had a bigger idea about God than did the prevailing Jewish nation. Jesus waited for a time before he began his ministry and his ministry shows that there is a better way of living. He took his ideas to the everyday people and they kept coming for more.

A personal encounter with Jesus is not the same thing for everybody. Some will have a profound experience that is so real for them that they cannot stop talking about it, while others will develop a quiet confident assurance. Still, others will seek out to live the life Jesus talked about.

The good news is that we are at various stages of the journey. So we may need to be tolerant and understanding of what Jesus means to us and for us. We do not need to get bogged down in a prescribed set of rules. So let's consider each other to be part of the answer about living a life in the Kingdom of God right here right now.
